## Some useful guidelines and hints for Junior Floral Art:

1. Tooth picks, pins, kebab sticks or other material can be used to stabilize the animal entries.
2. Accessories such as stones, shells or other items should be kept to a minimum as clutter may overshadow the theme of your entry.
3. Where possible, try to choose flowers or foliage that will last for the duration of the show.

## PRIZES

First Prize only awarded in Sections 1 to 7, Section Prize awarded in Sections 1 to 7. First, second and Third Prizes are awarded in all Junior Floral Art Classes except Class 3. Junior Floral Art Prizes are donated by Kenmore \& Indooroopilly Garden Clubs. The winning entry in Class 3 'Group Entry’ will receive the Convenor’s Prize.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entries received at Showground on Thursday $16^{\text {th }}$ May ( $3.30 \mathrm{pm}-6 \mathrm{pm}$ ) or Friday $17^{\text {th }}$ May ( $7.30 \mathrm{am}-8.45 \mathrm{am}$ ).
Judging will commence at 9.30am Friday 17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ May. 2024.
Junior Floral Art will be received up to 8.45 am on Saturday $18^{\text {th }}$ May. Judging will commence at 9.30 am
All exhibits except the Floral Art Section must be grown by the exhibitor for at least 3 months. Novice winners in Floral Art must move to the open class for future shows.

Where no competition exists in a Class, the judge will decide if a prize is to be awarded
Prize Cards will be completed for $1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }} \& 3^{\text {rd }}$ along with ribbons in each section where awarded.
Prize money will be awarded for First place in sections 1 to 7 .
Prizes can be collected on Sunday $19^{\text {th }}$ May 2024. Entries are to be collected by exhibitors after 3 pm on Sunday $19^{\text {th }}$ May 2024 or Monday $20^{\text {th }}$ May from 7am to 9am.

All Cut Flowers and Vegetables become the property of the Horticulture Section unless otherwise indicated by the exhibitor. Accessories are permitted in Section 7 unless otherwise stated.

Due care will be taken with all exhibits, however, Brookfield Show Society - Horticulture will not accept responsibility for any damage or theft.

All entries must be free from pests and diseases to avoid removal.

## HINTS AND TIPS

- Ensure that your pots are clean
- The plant should be in the centre of the pot
- Trim or remove any dead/faded leaves
- Plants in hanging baskets should have even coverage and if in flower there should be more open flowers than buds
- Cut flowers should be free from any blemishes or marks
- In produce classes (Section 6) part stem/stalk must be in evidence and when entering a class that requires three of the same variety exhibit specimens of the same size.
